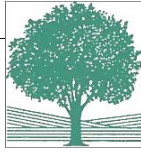

## WOODBURY COLLEGE RECEIVES GIFTS

### Vermont Foundation Makes \$50,000 Donation

Montpelier, Vt.—Woodbury College announced recently that it has received a number of significant gifts, including a major \$50,000 grant from a Vermont foundation (which requested anonymity) to support efforts to create new low-residence programs and add Masters’ degrees.

**The Agnes M. Lindsay Trust** provided a \$5000 grant for scholarship assistance for students from rural towns in Vermont, Maine, Massachusetts, and New Hampshire. Woodbury College has received this grant every year since 1991.

**Concept2**, the Vermont-based maker of fine rowing and fitness equipment, has given a \$1000 grant for the Emergency Grant and Loan Fund. Every year since 1995, Concept2 has provided these annual grants to help students remain in school through difficult times.

**The Occom Family Fund of the Upper Valley Community Foundation** gave a \$300 grant for expenses for presenting notable foreign speakers.

According to Woodbury College President Larry Mandell, “Approximately 85% of our students are eligible for financial aid. Grants such as these, from very generous organizations and individuals, allow us to help students realize their lifelong dreams by having a transforming educational experience at Woodbury.”
